


WHAT IS HOSPICE?

Hospice care is a type of health care that focuses on the palliation of a terminally ill patient's pain and symptoms and attending to their emotional and spiritual needs at the end of life.



WHAT IS **PALLIATIVE CARE?**

Palliative care is compassionate care focused on comfort. "To palliate" means to relieve. Palliative care allows patients to seek curative treatments but provides relief from pain and other distressing symptoms. It also utilizes a team approach to integrate emotional and spiritual aspects of care for those living with a life-limiting illness. Palliative care is provided through collaborating with the patient's attending physician. The goal is to allow patients to live as actively and comfortably as possible, and to help families and caregivers cope with the patient's illness.

2019 VOLUNTEERISM

Medicare requires at least 5% of direct patient care from a hospice agency be done by volunteers. In 2019, direct patient care hours totaled 7.32%. This provided a cost savings of \$89,325.12.

DAY OF CARING

More than **500** volunteers came together in 2019 from over 70 companies and organizations throughout Marshall County to collectively change our community for the better by donating their time and a multitude of supplies to complete 91 projects. During the event, SCH was chosen for 24 projects. Additionally, SCH staff participated in 2 projects.

INDIGENT CARE

In 2019, we provided \$327,065.11 in unreimbursed care. This represents revenue we would have earned if there had been a billable payor source.
