## WHAT IS PALLIATIVE CARE?


Palliative care is compassionate care focused on comfort. "To palliate" means to relieve. Palliative care allows patients to seek curative treatments but provides relief from pain and other distressing symptoms. It also utilizes a team approach to integrate emotional and spiritual aspects of care for those living with a life-limiting illness. Palliative care is provided through collaborating with the patient's attending physician. The goal is to allow patients to live as actively and comfortably as possible, and to help families and caregivers cope with the patient's illness.



## FOUNDATION SUCCESS IN 2022

PARTNERSHIPS WITH COMPASSIONATE INDIVIDUALS, BUSINESSES, AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS IN OUR NINE-COUNTY SERVICE AREA ARE VITAL TO ENSURE EVERYONE HAS ACCESS TO LIFE-CHANGING EXPERIENCES MADE POSSIBLE THROUGH PALLIATIVE CARE, HOSPICE AND GRIEF SUPPORT PROGRAMS.

THANKS TO THE GENEROSITY OF THE COMMUNITY, FUNDRAISING REVENUE INCREASED BY 11% IN 2022, AS COMPARED TO THE PREVIOUS YEAR. THIS MEANS MORE PEOPLE FOUND HOPE, COMPASSION, AND SUPPORT ON THEIR JOURNEY THROUGH CHRONIC ILLNESS, THE END OF LIFE, AND GRIEF.

## **2022 VOLUNTEERISM**

Medicare requires at least 5% of direct patient care from a hospice agency to be done by volunteers. In 2022\*, and despite the CMS waiver, direct patient care hours totaled 9.38%. This provided a cost savings of \$52,520.79.

\*Due to COVID-19, the 5% requirement was waived by CMS.

#### DAY OF CARING

In 2022, volunteers came together with companies and organizations throughout Marshall County to collectively change our community for the better by donating their time, talents and a multitude of necessities and supplies for those in need. **67** service projects were adopted throughout Marshall County, with over **30** different agencies in the county participating, while **47** companies and organizations participated in the event by holding a Casual Day. During the event, Shepherd's Cove Hospice was chosen for **20** projects. Additionally, SCH staff participated in **2** projects.

## **INDIGENT CARE**

In 2022, we provided **\$265,348.29** in unreimbursed care. This represents revenue we would have earned if there had been a billable payor source.

Of the indigent care provided, Marshall County recieved **54%** and all other counties served received the remaining **46%**.
